Purpose Room 3. The first two lectures featured Inger Andersen speaking about conservation and sustainable development, and Neal F. Lane, PhD., presenting on the relationships between scientists and the public. Hawaii Pacific University implemented a number of sustainable practices, including electronic communication and social media to promote the event. Attendees were encouraged to use alternative transportation to and from the events. Tableware was reusable or compostable. Recycling and composting helped divert a significant portion of the event's waste. In 2015, Hawaii Pacific University invested in Sika Roofing's EnergySmart Roof®, LED lighting and low flow bathroom toilets, and sink faucets in an effort to help reduce operational costs and environmental impact.
