The Kahala Hotel & Resort's Green Team is on a mission to implement sustainability initiatives to Reduce, Re-Use, Recycle



With the support of our ownership and management team, many projects were implemented in 2018. Some projects represent cost savings, while others increased our spending, but our long term environmental impact continues to improve

## Filtered water dispensers in back of house




