The hotel is central to Honolulu's most vibrant neighborhoods— Chinatown, Kaka'ako, Ala Moana and Waikiki. From the famous beaches and shopping of Waikiki and Ala Moana to the trendy restaurants that locals love, travelers can explore everything modern O'ahu offers. It's just around the corner from the Hawai'i Convention Center and steps away from beaches, shopping, nightlife, and island-style entertainment. Nearby landmark adventures include Pearl Harbor, Diamond Head State Monument and the hotel's 27-hole Arnold Palmer/Ed Seay championship golf course.

Perfectly positioned at the gateway of Waikiki neighborhoods and recently named the #2 hotel in Hawai'i by Conde Nast Traveler and Travel + Leisure in 2021, O'ahu's iconic, contemporary oceanfront hotel Prince Waikiki features redesigned guest rooms and suites with floor-to-ceiling ocean views; distinct cuisine, including the signature 100 Sails Restaurant and Bar and Katsumidori Sushi; a glistening infinity pool overlooking the harbor sunsets; and artful lobby with a suspended sculpture by Hawai'i artist Kaili Chun. The oceanfront hotel also features Honolulu Coffee Company; meeting rooms; event and wedding venues; and Hawai'i Prince Golf Club, a 27hole championship golf course located in Ewa Beach.

Prince Waikiki is one the first hotels and resorts in O'ahu to partner with Sustainable Coastlines Hawaii and Hawai'i Tourism Authority's Malama Hawai'i campaign. With Sustainable Coastlines Hawaii—a local, grassroots nonprofit organization inspiring communities to care for their coastlines through hands-on beach cleanups—Prince Waikiki offers guests the opportunity to help preserve the scenic beauty and coastlines in Waikiki.

Prince Waikiki also boasts an on-site, sustainable rooftop aquaponics garden to enhance Prince Waikiki's local, organic dining offerings. The closed-loop agricultural system produces crisp lettuces, herbs, and more, in support of the hotel's mission to use local and high-quality ingredients wherever possible.
