## Background:

Located at the gateway to Waikiki, Prince Waikiki is an upscale, oceanfront, 4 Diamond hotel that features 563 all ocean view guest rooms and suites, award winning dining including 100 Sails Restaurant and Bar, a signature adult infinity pool and more than 20,000 square feet of flexible indoor/outdoor meeting and event space. Certified as a “Hawaii Green Business” partner, Prince Waikiki continues its strong commitment to eco-friendly practices and sustainability efforts that support local community members and businesses. Recent initiatives include two new on-property sustainable gardens, zero food waste partnerships, nearly 100% locally sourced produce, leadership development programs for local youth and thanks to their beautiful oceanfront location, a strong partnership to protect the coastlines and waterways of the island of O‘ahu.

## Highlights:

- Chiller Optimization Project – Resulted in kWh reduction and received Hawai‘i Energy Rebates of \$51,155.50 to fund this project.
- Laundry Wash Cycles – Prince Waikiki adjusted their laundry chemical use to reduce 2 rinse cycles (100 gals per rinse cycle) per wash load. With an average of 1,500 wash loads per month, the water consumption has been reduced by approximately 300K gals per month.



- Water Fill Stations – Replaced single use water bottles with refillable aluminum water bottles. Nine water fill stations have been installed for guest and ambassador use—saving 101,936 single-use plastic bottles to date.

- Junior Ambassador Mentorship Program – Prince Waikiki are working with the Principals from the Campbell–Kapolei and Pearl City–Waipahu School Complex (elementary, middle, and high schools) to assist with their DOE hospitality electives. They are also working with Kupu Hawaii, University of Hawai'i Student Athletes, Kapi'olani Community College and Common Grace to share career awareness for the hospitality industry.

- Malie Refillable Large Cannisters – Replaced single use bottles for guest room's shampoo, body wash and hair conditioner with refillable large cannister bottles made from 100% Post-Consumer Recycled material.
